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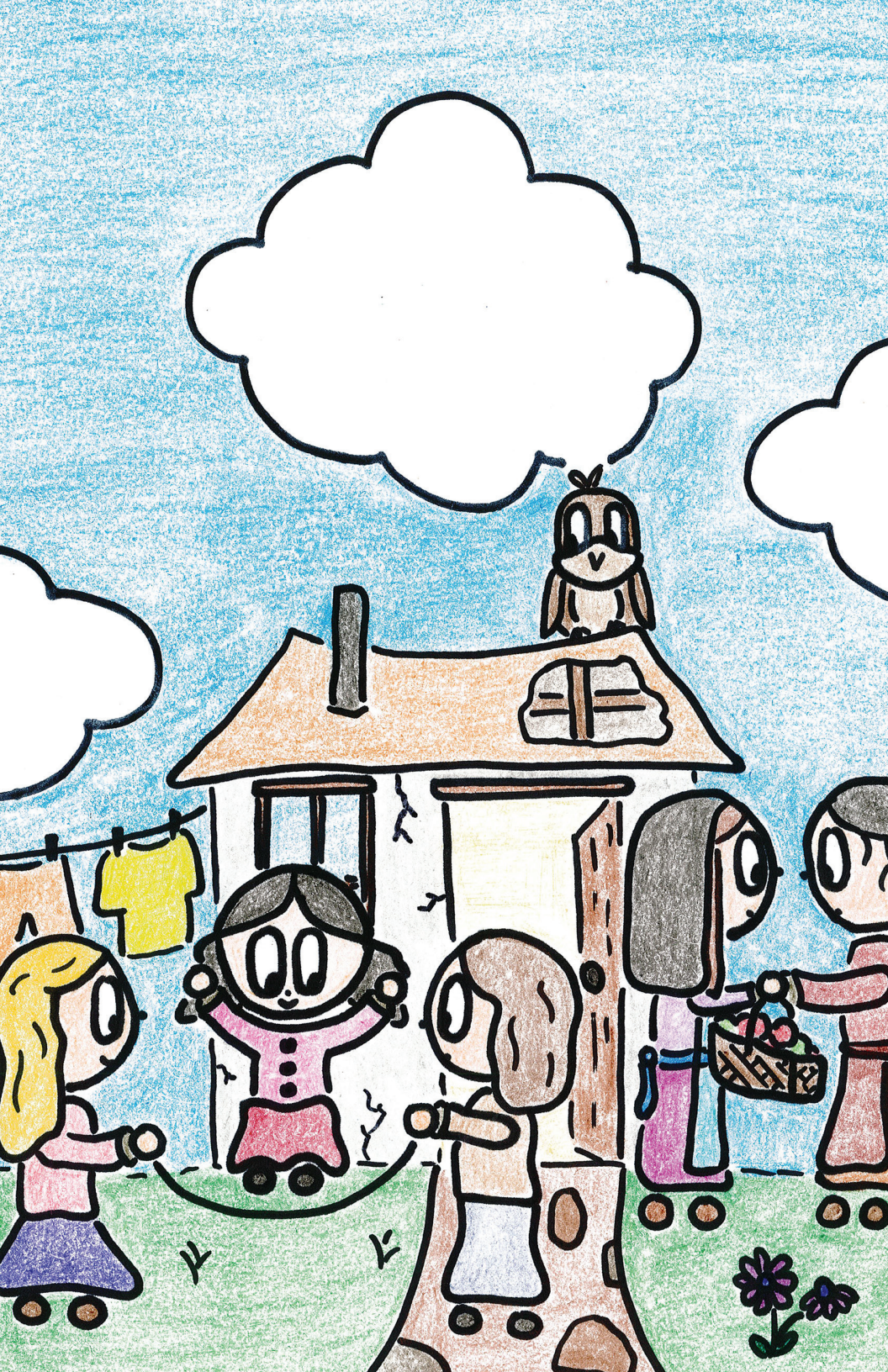

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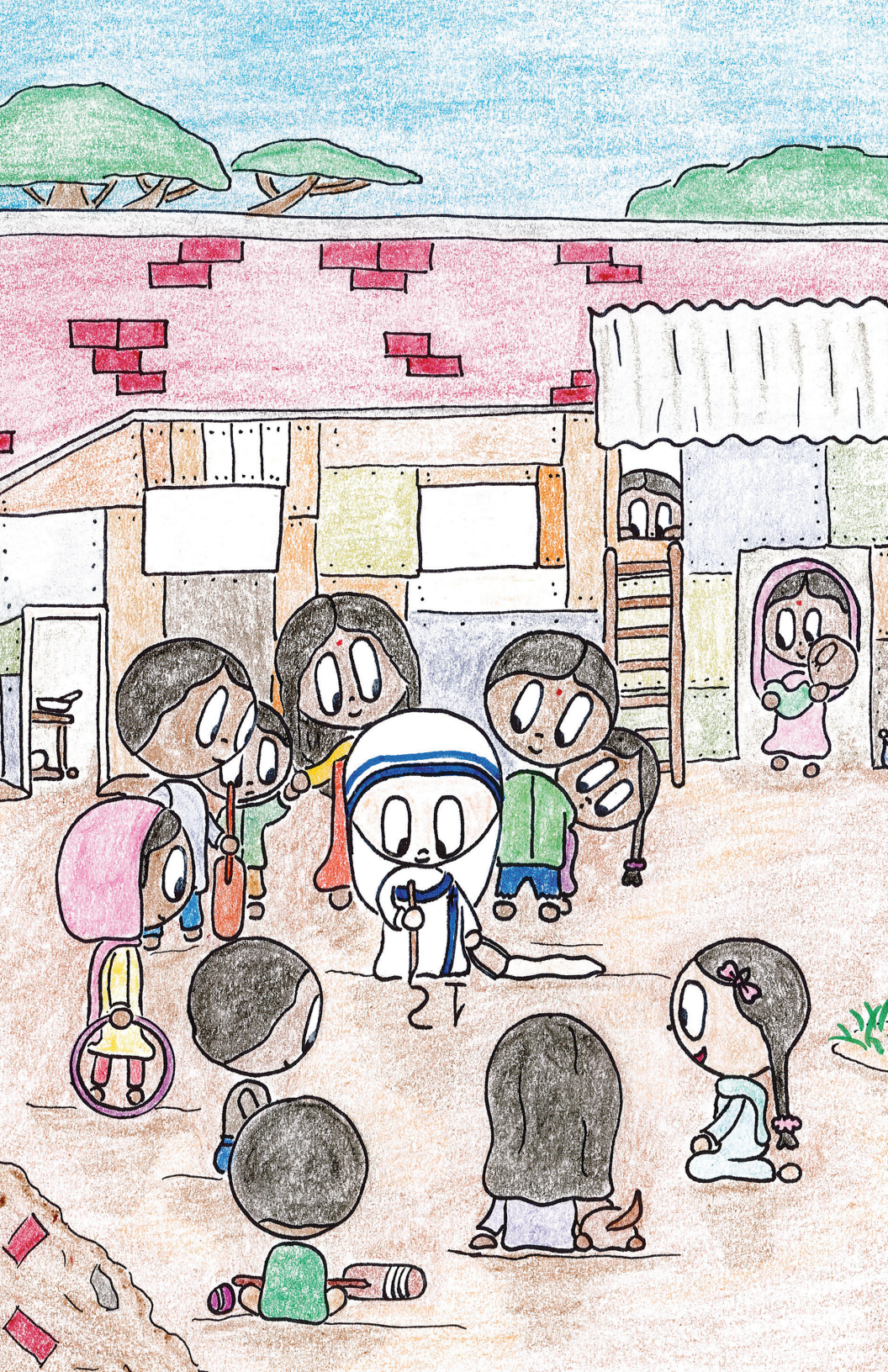
Agnes' parents taught her to care for others, especially the poor. Her father gave them money and things they needed. Her mother visited the poor and brought food to them.
