Saints and Me! is a series of children's books about saints, with six books in each set. *Saints of North America* honors holy men and women who blessed and served the land we call home. *Saints of Christmas* includes heavenly heroes who inspire us through Advent and Christmas and teach us to love the Infant Jesus.

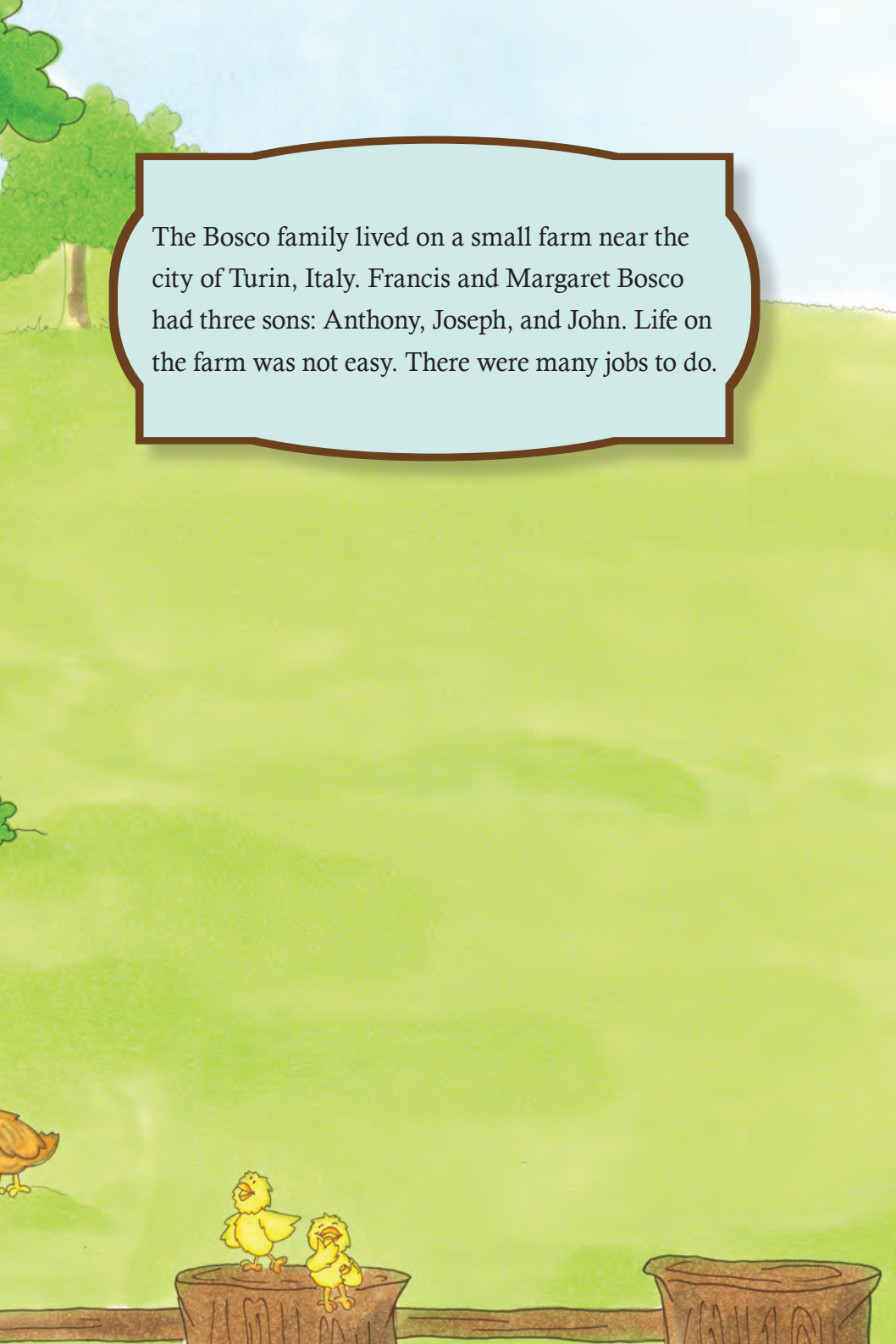
This set, *Saints for Families*, introduces the virtuous lives of seven saints from different times and places who modeled God's love and charity within and for families. Saint Thérèse of Lisieux felt the love of her family and carried it into her religious community (which included her sisters). Saint Anthony of Padua is the patron of infants and children. Saint John Bosco cared for young, homeless boys, raising them like sons. Saint Thomas More, a father of five, imitated Christ's sacrificial love and devotion to the truth until death. Saints Joachim and Anne became the grandparents of Jesus, raising Mary as a sinless disciple. And Saint Gerard Majella, the patron of pregnant mothers, blessed families with food, knowledge, penances, and healing miracles.

Which saint stood up against a king? Who became a tailor and a religious brother? Which saint is "the Little Flower"? Who was known for his excellent preaching? Which saints lived before Jesus? Which saint climbed trees, did flips, and turned cartwheels? Find out in the *Saints for Families* set—part of the *Saints and Me!* series—and help your child connect to the lives of the saints.

Introduce your children or students to the *Saints and Me!* series as they:

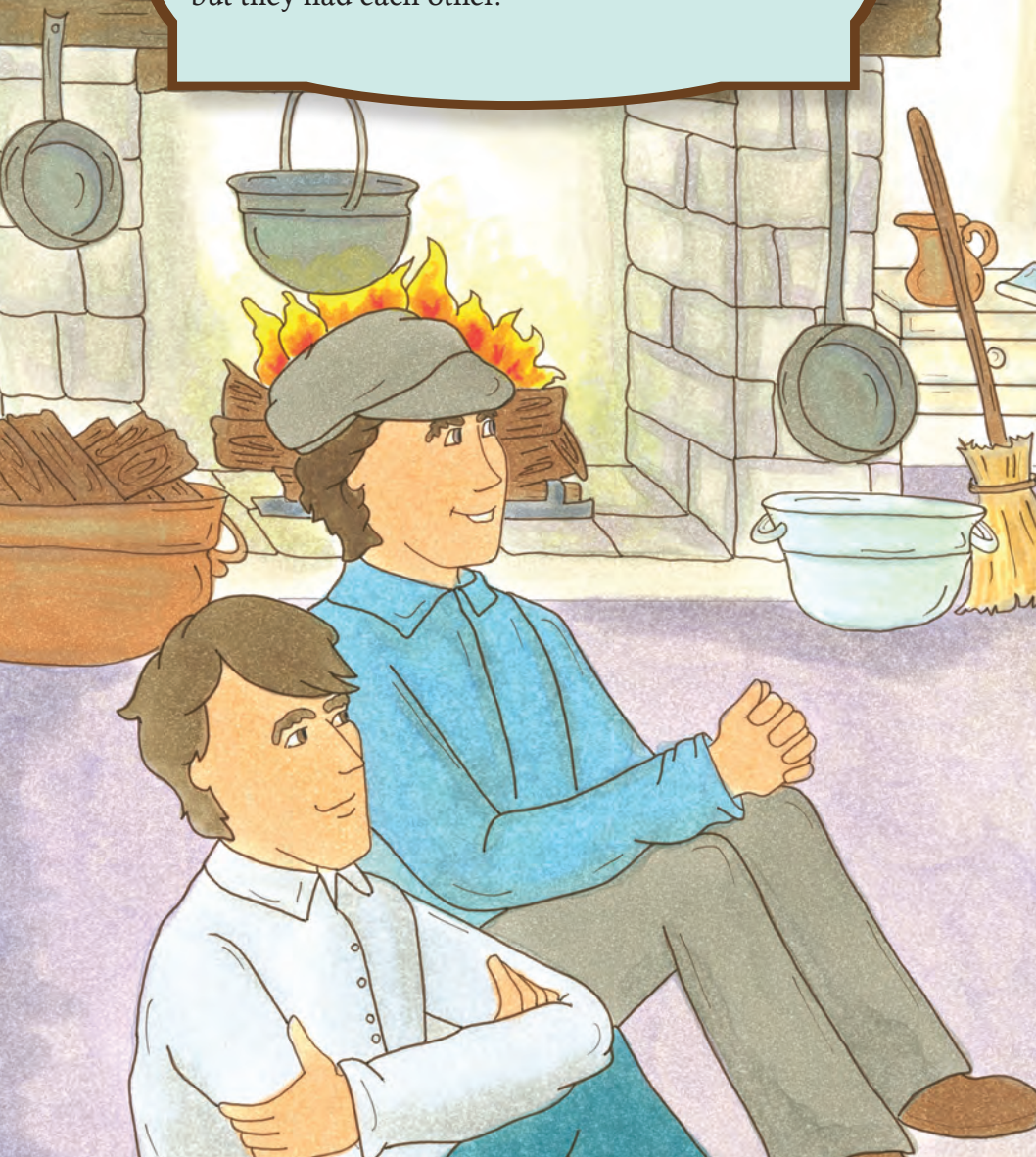
- READ** about the lives of the saints and are inspired by their stories.

They also had faith in God. Margaret told her children stories about God. "God wants us to help other people," she said. John listened to his mother. He liked to pray and go to church.

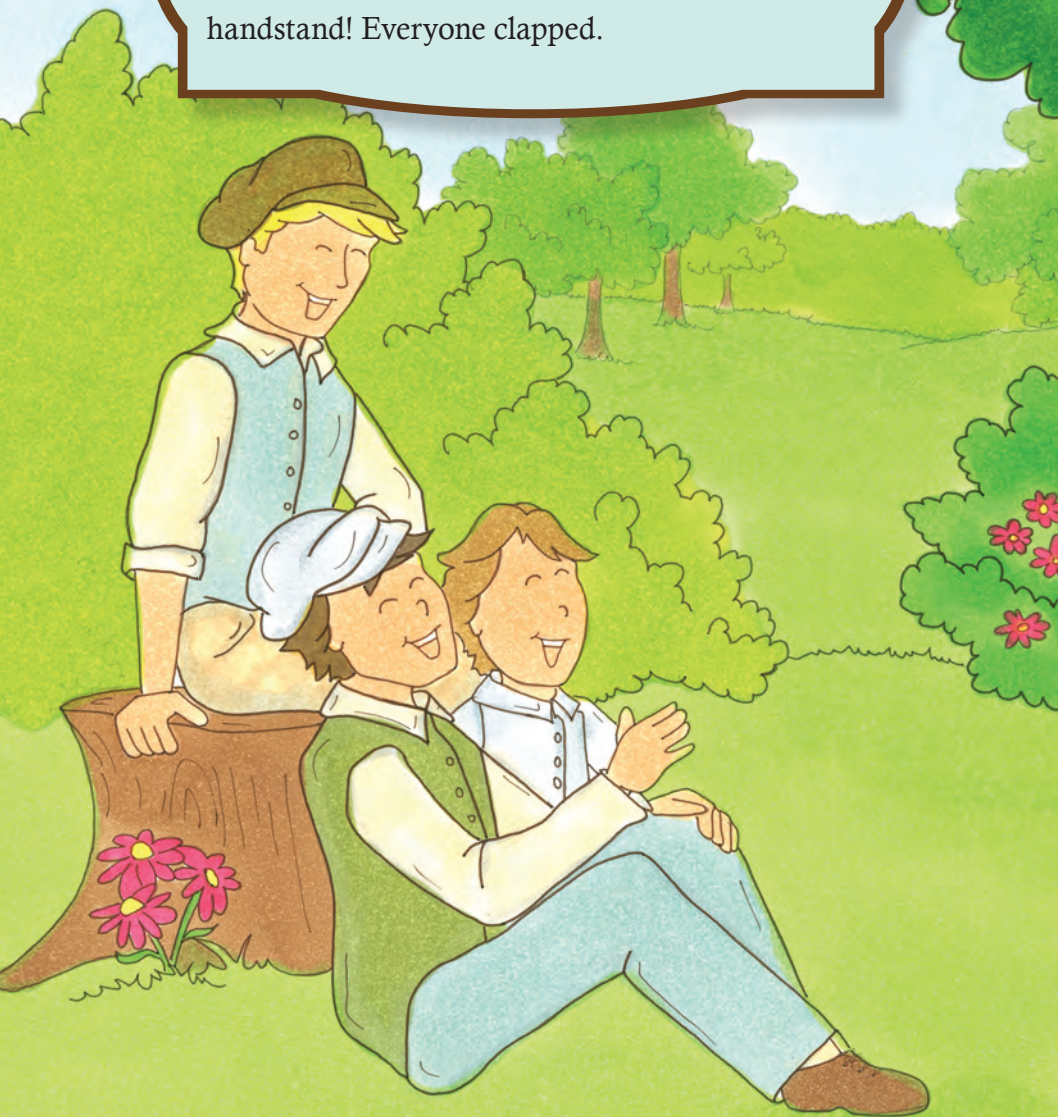


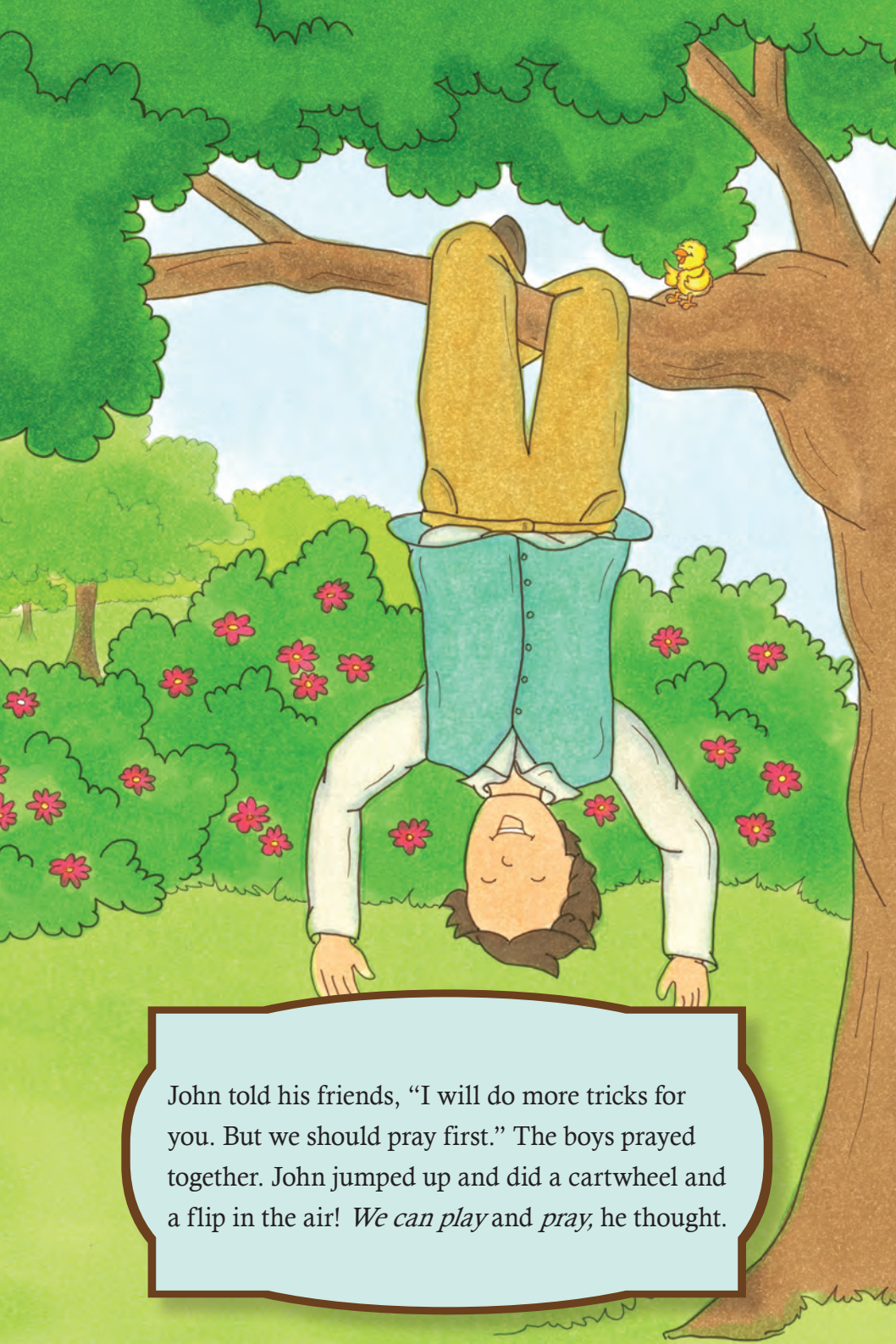
