explaining GOD'S WORD

Epiphany of the Lord (A) • Matthew 2:1-12 • January 5, 2014

CAST: Narrator; Three Wise Men; King Herod; Chief priest; Mary; Baby Jesus (a doll will do nicely).

(The Holy Family should be in a room apart from where the play begins.)

Narrator: After Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, Wise Men from the East arrived one day in Jerusalem inquiring:

First Wise Man: Where is the newborn king? We saw his star and have come to pay him homage.

Narrator: King Herod was upset when he heard this. He called his chief priest.

Herod: Where is this new king to be born?

Chief priest: In Bethlehem of Judea, according to the prophets.

Herod: Go to Bethlehem. When you find the child, report to me so I may go and see him too.

Narrator: Of course, Herod was lying. He really wanted to hurt the Baby Jesus because he was jealous of him.

(The Wise Men move toward the room where Jesus is.)

First Wise Man: Look, the star has stopped over that house.

Second Wise Man: That must be where the child is.

Third Wise Man: Let's go in and see him.

Narrator: On entering the house, they found the child with Mary his mother. They knelt before him and presented him with gifts.

First Wise Man: What a beautiful baby. Here is my gift of gold for him.

Second Wise Man: And I give him the sweet fragrance of frankincense.

Third Wise Man: And I give him myrrh. Come, we must get some rest for our long journey home.

(The Wise Men leave and find a place to lie down.)

Narrator: That night an angel appeared to the Wise Men and told them not to return to Herod. So they went back to their own country by another route.

(The Wise Men slowly begin their journey home, carefully avoiding the place where Herod is.)
